Attendance:

ATTENDANCE IS REQUIRED. As per the Student Handbook: When a student has accumulated **unofficial** absences in excess of the number of times the class meets per week, the instructor may, but is not required to, file a withdrawal from the class. Each additional absence will affect your final grade as outlined below. Official absences (MCC field trips, MCC tournaments, jury duty, etc.) and observance of religious holidays will not be counted as absences. The instructor must be notified before the official absence or religious holiday and the student will need to provide appropriate documentation.

2 absences = -5 points/1/2 letter grade

3 absences = -10 points/1 letter grade

4 absences = -15 points/1-1/2 grades

5 absences = -20 points/2 letter grades

6 absences = -25 points/2-1/2 letter grades

7 absences = Automatic failure and withdrawal from class

2 tardies or early dismissals = 1 absence

If you must be absent, please attain a substitute player to cover your part. It is very difficult to rehearse without everybody present, and is not fair to the other members of the ensemble.
